The front cover shows members of the ADF taking part in an ANZAC Day commemoration at Tarin Kot, Afghanistan. Australia's role in Afghanistan began in October 2001 when coalition forces, under American leadership, invaded Afghanistan and removed the ruling Taliban regime. Australian Special Air Service (SAS) squadrons took part in operations in the mountainous areas south of Kabul, carrying out reconnaissance and surveillance. ADF personnel have been praised for their capabilities and professionalism.

The decision to withdraw Australian troops from Afghanistan was announced in March 2013. In 2014, approximately 400 ADF personnel will continue training and advising the Afghan National Security Forces in Kabul and Kandahar. Australia will also supply instructors, advisors and support staff to the British-led Afghan National Army Officer Academy in Kabul.

Some 40 Australians have been killed and 261 + wounded serving on operational deployments to Afghanistan.

Commemorating ANZAC Day allows Australians to **HONOUR** the service of Australia's veterans; **REMEMBER** the sacrifice of the fallen; **THANK** those who have returned; and **RENEW** our bonds of community and our understanding of the ANZAC traditions of courage and comradeship.


