honour remember thank renew

Today, Saturday 25th April 2015, we mark the 100th Anniversary of the ANZAC landings at Gallipoli. At 4.30 am 100 years ago, members of the 3rd Brigade, First Australian Division consisting of the 9th (Queensland), 10th (South Australian), 11th (Western Australian) and 12th (Tasmanian) Battalions A.I.F. landed with New Zealand, British, French and Indian soldiers on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Author of 'The Story of Anzac'. Charles Bean wrote that of the 8.000 ANZAC men who landed that first morning at least 2,300 were killed. Men that these countries 'could ill afford to lose. But with their lives they purchased a tradition beyond all human power to appraise'.

The 10th Battalion, with unit strength of 31 officers and 974 other ranks, included men recruited from Semaphore, Port Adelaide and surrounding districts. It was a battalion that reported 397 men killed or wounded in the first 15 days of the landing and by the end of the campaign in September 1915 they listed 711 casualties.

ANZAC legend suggests that on that first day two members of this South Australian battalion, Lance Corporal Philip Robin and Private Arthur Blackburn, who was born in Woodville, South Australia, made it the furthest inland. Robin was killed later in the day whilst Blackburn would later go on and earn a Victoria Cross at Pozieres. France.

This dawn landing 'would go down in history' and start a tradition of remembrance for the sacrifice and service of those men and women from both Australia and New Zealand who have since participated in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations around the world. Above all, we remember the 102,804 who have given their lives for our nation. It is a tradition that in this 100th year the Semaphore and Port Adelaide RSL and, the community it represents are proud to continue.

Although they do not walk amongst us, today their spirit remains strong. Lest We Forget.
